Various kinds of equipment are small enough to be utilized inside of warehouses or in plants, and can be specially designed to move pallets and boxes. Bigger machine is customarily utilized outdoors to grade land and clear areas in preparation for construction.

There are several projects that require the skill of a heavy equipment operator, including public works projects and endeavors of privately owned companies. Jobs completed by public works offices can comprise construction of roads and the building of bridges.
