Forklift License Kamloops - In North America, getting a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machinery which is designed along with many options, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and a wide variety of types and sizes to meet the industrial requirements of employees. Operator training courses are normally individualized to be able deal with the specific types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift in a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and businesses. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to focus on specific course requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training that is provided by the employer is the most common form of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to offer practical training and classroom sessions on machinery at their place of work. Employers could opt to train workers on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The course incorporates lift truck operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety measures and company rules. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like for instance dangerous conditions or materials, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every type of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most vital factor of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one type of equipment to another. Safety problems vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for instance in marine and offshore operations.
